St. Lucia 1986

Before anything else, you must be equipped with a good set of cooking pots and pans.



Papua 1977, Ciskei 1985, Somalia 1999

First step: gather wood (preferably dry) to prepare a fire. Small wood can simply be put on the ground (Papua) or better still be stacked vertically according to the Scouting method (Somalia, Ciskei).



Cuba 2002, Nigeria 1989

An experienced Scout must not use more than 3 matches to light a fire, whatever the weather conditions are.



Indonesia 1986, Burundi 1967, Iraq 1967, Zimbabwe 1987

The simplest fireplace is made of stones used as fire protection and as support for the billycans to be heated.
